COURSE TITLE: Rail Car Response Training For Crude Oil and Flammable Liquids Incidents

DATE: September 7, 2017

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Rail Car Incident Response for Crude, Ethanol, and Other Flammable Liquids training workshop is developed for the U.S. Department of Transportation Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (DOT PHMSA). This workshop educates emergency responders on freight rail car incidents involving hazardous materials, specifically crude oil, ethanol, and other flammable liquids.

As more and more rail traffic transports cargo, including hazardous materials, the responder community must fully understand the dangers and unique hazards presented with rail cars carrying these commodities. This free 8-hour training workshop improves the emergency responder's ability to assess the scene of a rail car incident, and understand the resources needed to remediate the emergency situation, including how the railroad will play a critical role in the response.

Hands-On Training:

Scenarios using a rail car simulator will be conducted, including:

- Identifying the design, construction, components and markings of rail tank cars that carry crude/flammable liquids
- Recognizing and identifying the chemical being transported, and the properties to be considered in an emergency
- Assessing the scene to determine the potential hazards to people, property, and the environment
- Recognizing offensive, defensive, and non-intervention mitigation strategies for fire and/or spill incidents
- Identifying key rail/freight industry resources and federal, state, and private assistance options

PARTICIPANT CRITERIA:

Participants should be management level personnel representing jurisdictions such as states, counties, or cities including public services agencies, fire services, law enforcement, emergency medical services, emergency planning, public health, hazardous materials response, or the private industry.

PERQUISITE:

There are no specific course prerequisites; however, participants are strongly encouraged to complete incident management courses IS 100, IS 200, and IS 700 online at www.nimsonline.com before attending this course.
